Brooklyn Museum Announces Registration for Gallery/Studio Program Summer Session 2004

The Brooklyn Museum's **Gallery/Studio** program offers fun and challenging studio art courses for children, age six and up, and adults. Through instruction in the galleries and in the studio, each course develops skills in viewing and creating art. Participants explore the Museum's renowned collections, discover new art materials, and create their own works of art. Students increase their visual vocabulary, develop critical and analytical skills, and gain confidence in their abilities. There are classes in painting, printmaking, drawing, sculpture, and mixed media. This summer, class titles include "New Century, New Brooklyn" for adults; "Environmental Panoramas" for 14-18 year olds; "Representing the Self" for 12-14 year olds; "Patterns, Embellishments, Costume" for 10-12 year olds; and "Beat, Rhythm, and Sound" for 6-7 year olds. An exhibition of work by *Gallery/Studio* students will be held in the Museum's Education Gallery at the conclusion of the semester. July Term classes will meet every Wednesday and Friday, July 7-30. Classes during August will meet every Wednesday and Friday, August 4-27. The Weekend Term will meet every Saturday, July 10-August 28. All classes are two hours long.

Gallery/Studio registration forms for the 2004 Summer Session may be picked up at the Museum, printed at **www.brooklynmuseum.org**, or received by mail or fax by calling the Education Division at (718) 501-6230. Completed registration forms may be mailed or faxed to the Museum or dropped off at the Museum's Admission desk from June 7 through June 30. In-person registration takes place in the Education Gallery from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. from June 25 through June 27. Registration forms of Museum Members will receive priority handling on a first-come, first-served basis from June 7 through June 20. Registration forms of non-Members will be processed in the order in which they are received from June 21 through June 30. Early registration is encouraged, since classes fill up quickly.

The fee for Members is \$130 (\$115 tuition +\$15 registration fee). The fee for non-Members is \$145 (\$130 tuition +\$15 registration fee). There are a limited number of scholarships available for students up to the age of eighteen, and work-study positions for high school students.
