**Enjoy an Eclectic Mix of Music and Culture at the Brooklyn Museum's Free Target First Saturday on February 4 from 5 to 11 p.m.**

At the Brooklyn Museum's **Target First Saturdays**, thousands of visitors enjoy **free** programs of art and entertainment each month. February's event will include an eclectic mix of music and culture.

From **6 to 8 p.m.**, enjoy the sounds of **Folklore Urbano**, a unique jazz band that draws on the rich legacy of Afro-Colombian music to create new rhythms and harmonies. Also at **6 p.m.**, members of the **Brooklyn Philharmonic** present medieval French music plus excerpts from one of Carl Orff's most popular compositions, *Carmina Burana*, enlivened by the voices of elementary school students. The performance is repeated at 7 p.m. *Tickets are available beginning at 5 p.m.*

From **6:30 to 8:30 p.m.**, create a horn inspired by the Museum's Nigerian Horn Blower sculpture. *Free timed tickets are available in the Education Gallery beginning at 6 p.m.* At **7 p.m.**, **Teresa A. Carbone**, Chair and Andrew W. Mellon Curator of American Art, leads a tour exploring the intersections of modern music and modern art in the **American Identities** galleries. *Tickets are available beginning at 6 p.m.* At **7:30 p.m.**, join a Student Guide on an interactive tour addressing little-known aspects of daily life in ancient Egypt, including music-making and celebration. *Tickets are available beginning at 6:30.*

From **8:15 to 9 p.m.**, storyteller Linda Humes shares stories for all ages stemming from traditional tales of Africa, the Caribbean, and the Americas. At **8:30 p.m.**, Professor Maria de Longoria of Medgar Evers College introduces **Daughters of the Dust** (Julie Dash, 1991, 113 min., NR), a landmark film exploring the unique culture of the Gullah people—descendants of slaves who lived on the Sea Islands off the Georgia coast. A Q & A session follows the film. *Tickets are available beginning at 7:30 p.m.* And from **9 to 11 p.m.**, **DJ Emskee** of WBAI-FM spins music from the 1980s.

Throughout the evening, a cash bar will offer beer and wine and the Museum Café will serve a wide variety of sandwiches, salads, and beverages. The Museum Shop will remain open until 11 p.m.

Some *Target First Saturday* programs have limited space and must be ticketed; lines for free tickets often form 30 minutes in advance. Programs are subject to change without notice. Museum galleries are open until 11 p.m. Parking is a flat rate of \$4 from 5 to 11 p.m.
