### **Brooklyn Museum Gallery/Studio Program Announces Registration for Spring Semester 2007**

The Brooklyn Museum's **Gallery/Studio Program** offers a season of fun with challenging studio art courses for students age six to adult. Participants develop art skills through studying the Museum's collections and special exhibitions and experimenting with materials and creative techniques in hands-on classes. Instruction is available in painting, printmaking, drawing, sculpture, digital photography, and mixed media. Each class has ten two-hour sessions. Spring semester classes are offered on Saturdays and Sundays beginning March 10 and 11.

Registration forms and payment in full must be received (by mail, fax, or drop off) by March 4. Since classes fill up quickly, early registration is encouraged. Tuition is \$195 for Museum Members, \$215 for non-Members, and \$15 for scholarship recipients. Members receive priority handling, on a first-come, first-served basis, December 5 through January 21. Registration forms of non-Members will be processed in the order in which they are received, January 22 through March 4.

Scholarships are available for students ages six to eighteen. High school students can apply for the work-study program, in which students attend a Gallery/Studio Program course free of charge in exchange for assisting Museum instructors in classes with students ages six through nine. The application deadline is January 21 for scholarships and January 28 for the work-study program.
