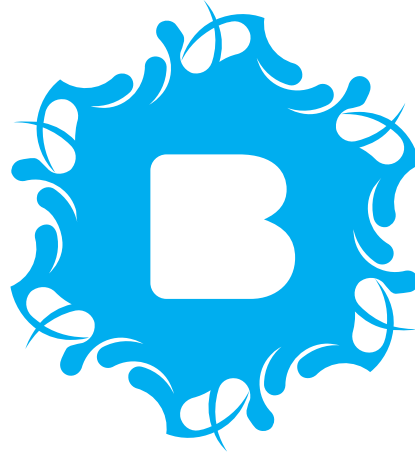

Saturdays and Sundays, participants meet in the Rubin Lobby promptly at **11 a.m. and 2 p.m.** **Children age four to seven** and accompanying adult friends explore the galleries and create art in each ninety-minute class. *Arty Facts* offers a different program each day.
